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Mrs Nicole Green is an experienced Secondary English teacher who is currently Head of the English Department at Northpine Christian College, a large Adventist K-12 campus in Brisbane. Closing the Gap

By age 3, children of professional parents are a full year ahead of their poorer peers. By age 10, the gap is 3 years. When asked about the number of children who don't complete school in her city, a Finnish official replied, "I can tell you their names if you want". Singapore narrowed its achievement gap from 17% to 5%.

How to close the gaps?

- Get children into education early. Children from poor backgrounds who go to quality pre-school earn more, have better jobs and are less likely to end up in prison or divorced.
- Increase the time spent at school so there is more time to learn.
- Recruit the best for teacher training and train them well. Evaluate teachers regularly, invest in further training and give bonuses only to the top teachers.
- Give individualised attention to struggling children. One in three Finnish students get extra help each year from a tutor.

HIGHER SCHOOL CERTIFICATE INFORMATION –FOR EVERYONE TO READ!


The Higher School Certificate examinations begin this Thursday. Our students will be taking their exams in the hall. As you can imagine, the noise of children can be quite distracting so we need to make alternate entry and exit arrangements into and out of the school.

During the HSC Examination period, students who are walked into school need to be walked through the main bus gate and around to the left, rather than past the seating and bubblers. Also, students who sit on the benches at the back of the hall will now wait for their pick ups on the COLA. As you drive around we will call your child up to the gate for you. If you normally park and walk to the bottom gate, you will need to come through the main entrance gate (where the bus students line up) and proceed to your left to collect your children from the COLA.


We understand that these arrangements are not ideal, but want to give our Year 12 students the very best chance at success.


