## From the Principal...

### The Essence of Adventist Education

As we have settled into the 2011 school year at KAS it has been great to meet with new members of our school community, and in many cases share a little of the unique vision of education that makes KAS the progressive learning community that it is. Oftentimes, when meeting school community members I am asked questions like, "What is it that makes Adventist Education distinctive?" or "Why will sending my child to KAS make a difference to their education?" or statements such as, "I don't know what it is, but my child is a different person since they've enrolled at KAS!"

In answering such questions, it would be easy to simply focus on all the worthwhile and innovative aspects of our school program. However, that would certainly be selling short the true essence of our school. KAS, as part of the world-wide system of Adventist schools, the second-largest system of private schools in the world, has a long and proud heritage of providing excellence in education across a range of social, economic and political spheres which goes well beyond the "three Rs".

Whilst our distinctiveness is not easily defined, the core principles listed below go some way towards describing the aspects of our program which set KAS apart as a school.

Those core principles are:

- An acknowledgment of the living God of the Bible as the source of all wisdom and virtue.
- That true education is based on biblical principles and understandings.
- A recognition of students as complex and unique individuals created in God's image with a purpose in life.
- Nurturing the balanced development of the whole person.
- An encouragement of a holistic perspective of faith, learning and practice, with the curriculum addressing the major needs in spiritual, intellectual, physical, social, emotional and vocational development.
- An acknowledgement of the significant role of teachers as models of Christian grace, demonstrating professional competence in teaching, pastoral care and ministry.
- Encouraging excellence in all areas with diverse opportunities being provided.
- Employment of methods that are sensitive to the various abilities and needs of all, with students being engaged in tasks individually and collaboratively.
- Recognition of discipline as the development of self-management and values-based decision-making.
- Teaching, by example, that service to others is our highest calling.
- Maintenance of school community through a close liaison with families, the school and the church.

KAS values the support of each and every member of our school community, as within the framework of Adventist education outlined above, we seek to provide education and support for each of our students which goes far beyond the "three Rs."

### YR 11 INFORMATION EVENING

All families and students of Year 11 students are invited to a meeting to be held next week on Monday 21st February at 7:30PM in the chapel. Teachers of Year 11 students will be in attendance to provide families with a chance to meet them.

### YR 12 INFORMATION EVENING

All families and students are invited to attend an Information Evening this Thursday 17th February at 6:30pm in the Chapel that will provide a clear overview of HSC requirements and assessment tasks. Strategies to support your child in achieving their best will be shared along with expectations of being a Year 12 student at KAS. Families will have an opportunity to meet class teachers.

### SECONDARY STUDENT SERVICES: 'MERITS'

'PB' stands for Personal Best! All students in our school are encouraged to set both short and long term goals. Teacher's regularly give out PB stickers to encourage good choices as well as the achievement of goals. Students are encouraged to keep these in their diaries. When seven stickers have been collected, they are to take their diary to Mr Simmons at the beginning of lunchtime to have them counted. Each set of seven stamps means your child receives a 'merit.' As merits are collected, different rewards are achieved:

30 Merits= Lou's Voucher

40 Merits= Movie

The top Merit Earner for each class= \$10 gift voucher

A reward day is held at the end of each term where the above rewards are redeemed.

You can encourage your child to achieve their Personal Best by encouraging them to wear correct uniform, do homework, organise their books ready for class, follow instructions, read more, wear their hat etc

### SECONDARY STUDENT SERVICES: 'DEMERITS'

In the event that your child fails to comply with school rules they will receive a Demerit. Demerits are either worth 1 point (Minor Demerit) or 3 points (Major Demerit). Every three points will result in a detention that occurs during lunchtime. The students are given the opportunity to eat their lunch and are involved in tasks for their detention. Minor Demerits include choices such as: Eating in class, continual failure to take books/equipment to class, continual lateness to class, deliberate littering, untidy or incorrect uniform. Major Demerits include, but are not limited to the following: truancy, deliberate damage to property, blatant disrespect, bullying, failure to attend a detention, obscene language, etc.
