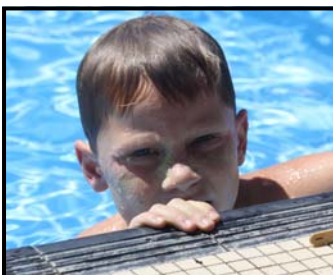
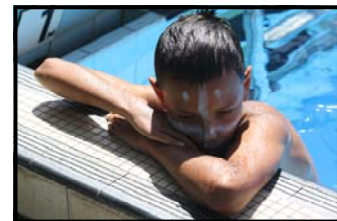

## From the Principal...

### Academic Success – Genes or Just hard Work?

In the last few weeks, KAS has held Information Evenings for various classes in both the primary and secondary schools. One of the key purposes of such evenings is to help families develop further understanding, not only of the academic requirements of various awards such as the School Certificate and the HSC, but also the general processes and programs of the school.

A common theme to come out of such evenings is the feedback received from parents relating to the lack of commitment shown by their children towards homework or study more generally. In discussing this factor with a number of students, it would appear that there is some reluctance to acknowledge that plain hard work at any level will result in them achieving academic success. It is almost as though some students feel that one is either 'gifted' to succeed at school or apparently 'destined' to perform poorly.

Consequently, many students seem to opt for the path of least resistance, and rather than choosing to invest their time in what they consider to be arduous study, they choose the softer option of TV, the internet and other pursuits, which may ultimately lead them nowhere towards achieving the academic success they are capable of.

Consider for a moment the following information taken from *Fortune* magazine, a well respected business monthly:

*"What makes Tiger Woods great? What made Berkshire Hathaway (Charts) Chairman Warren Buffett the world's premier investor? We think we know: Each was a natural who came into the world with a gift for doing exactly what he ended up doing. As Buffett told Fortune not long ago, he was "wired at birth to allocate capital." It's a one-in-a-million thing. You've got it - or you don't.*

*Well, folks, it's not so simple. For one thing, you do not possess a natural gift for a certain job, because targeted natural gifts don't exist. You are not a born CEO or investor or chess grandmaster. You will achieve greatness only through an enormous amount of hard work over many years. And not just any hard work, but work of a particular type that's demanding and painful.*

*Scientists worldwide have conducted scores of studies since 1993... the first major conclusion is that nobody is great without work. It's nice to believe that if you find the field where you're naturally gifted, you'll be great from day one, but it doesn't happen. There's no evidence of high-level performance without experience or practice".*  
(Fortune magazine 30 Oct. 2006)

KAS has published recommended amounts of homework for each secondary year level. These can be found in the various handbooks and build on the homework program in the primary school. At the end of the day, homework alone will not cure every ill; however, it goes a long way towards supporting the knowledge and skills gained at school.

For some students homework is hard work. It is, however, undeniably a key element to success at HSC level and beyond. No child can be expected to embrace the required 2-3 hours of nightly homework at HSC level unless they have established study patterns well before the HSC years arrive. All members of the KAS community are encouraged to support our students as they struggle with the "hard work" of homework and build the required self-discipline which will lead to personal achievement not only at school but also in life beyond the classroom.
