ANNOUNCEMENTS

ANZAC DAY

Thankyou to those parents who brought their students to march in the Anzac March during the holidays.

CROSS COUNTRY

All students should have received an information sheet about the cross country races on Thursday. Primary students will be running at school while secondary students will race at a property in Collombatti. Primary parents are welcome to come and cheer their children on, with racing commencing at 9:30am.

In the event of significant expected rain, the cross country will be postponed to another time. A decision will be made on Wednesday, 2 May.

Our annual KAS BUSHDANCE has crept up and will be held on Saturday night, 12 May, from 6-9:30PM. This is a social event for the school community, as well as being a fundraiser for the Yr 10, 11 and 12 expedition programs. As such, all students planning on going on these trips are expected to attend and help and are encouraged to arrive at 5:15PM. MEDICARE TEEN DENTAL VOUCHER

The Medicare Teen Dental Voucher entitles 12 to 17 year olds to a preventative dental check. If you received a voucher you can register your child with our service by contacting the Oral Health Contact Centre on 1300 651 625.

As a public dental service, we will complete any further treatment required, free of charge, once you have used your voucher with us. Alternatively you can use your voucher with a private dental practitioner of your choice with the option of paying for all further required treatment. The vouchers will expire on 31st December 2012. All children aged between 0-18 are eligible to receive free general dental treatment through the Mid North Coast Local Health Network. Parents do not need to hold a pension card or health care card for their child to be eligible. Please call the Oral Health Contact Centre on 1300 651 625 if you would like your child to have a check-up. Waiting times are minimal at present.

NAPLAN- Years 3, 5, 7 & 9

These national tests will run on Tues 15-Thurs 17 May. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 can help themselves to achieve their best by having regular sleep of 8-10 hours, eating a low GI breakfast each morning (grains will slowly release their energy in your body, that is, oats, wheat, rice, etc), and regularly exercising to ensure the flow of blood is assisting their body to work well. Families can support their children with the above as well as by encouraging them to try their best in a positive way. The following website will give you an idea of the format of the test. Please be reminded that this test is just a snap shot of your child's achievements. PRIMARY UNIFORM

ASSIGNMENTS IN ON TIME

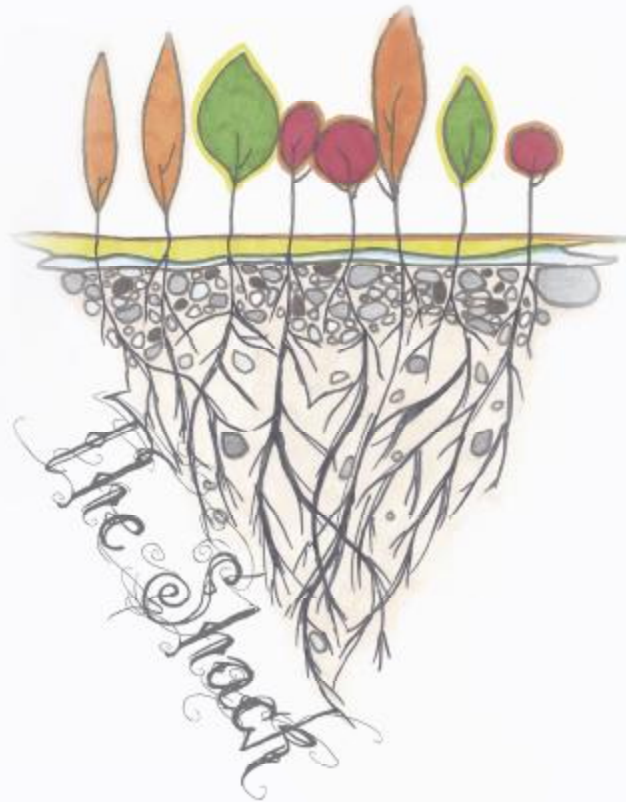
