SCARLET FEVER

We have had several reported cases of Scarlet Fever in the primary school. Please make yourself aware of the signs and symptoms of this disease and seek medical attention if your child shows any. These include:

- sore throat and fever (high temperature) are the typical first symptoms.
- a bright red (scarlet) rash then soon develops. This is caused by a toxin (poison) that is released into the blood stream by the streptococcal bacteria.
- the rash starts as small red spots, usually on the neck and upper chest. It soon spreads to many other parts of the body and may feel like sandpaper. The rash tends to blanch (go white) if you press on it. The face is usually spared by the rash, but may become quite flushed.
- the tongue may become pale but coated with red spots

('strawberry tongue'). After a few days the whole tongue may look red.

- other common symptoms include: headaches, nausea and vomiting, being off food, and feeling generally unwell.

Infected children should be excluded from child care or school until they are well, and at least 24 hours after starting antibiotic treatment. (<http://www.public.health.wa.gov.au>)

Why Internet safety matters

In today's 24/7 media world, it's hard to believe that remnants of your digital footprint can remain online for a long, long time. Teens don't realize that once something is posted on the Internet it can come back to haunt them. Even if they take down an inappropriate photo, the electronic record remains. And during the time a potentially embarrassing photo is public, it may have been copied and circulated to thousands of people without your teen's knowledge. Teens may not realize that what they post sets their reputation. Other people might judge them based on their profiles. It's not just inappropriate photos that put them at risk. Teens might also post references to underage drinking and engage in mean-spirited chat. As kids get older, stuff they've posted in the past can reappear. According to a 2008 Kaplan survey, 10% of college admissions officers at the nation's top 500 colleges looked at applicants' social networking profiles. 38% of them said that what they saw "negatively affected" their opinion of the applicant.

Teens make new online connections all the time. Programs that connect people -- like social networks or location sharing apps-- can potentially expose your teen to people they don't know who may not be trustworthy. Teens need to know not to give up their privacy or allow strangers to identify who -- or where -- they are.

Strategies for a responsible -- and safer -- online life

- There's no such thing as "private" online. Anything posted can be seen by or forwarded to strangers, school/university admissions officers, and potential employers.
- Have an agreement about what's okay to post. This means no embarrassing or cruel posts, no hate speech or groups, no compromising pictures they wouldn't want the whole world to see.
- Help your teen be a good digital citizen. With privileges and power comes responsibility and flagging inappropriate content isn't tattling
- The Golden Rule applies in cyberspace. If they wouldn't do it in real life, they shouldn't do it online.
- Agree on downloads. What music is okay? Which video sites? What games?
- Encourage critical thinking. Your teens should ask "who posted this? Why?" "Why am I posting this? Who will see it? Could it be misunderstood?"
- Stay in safe places. Avoid creepy places unpleasant content or talk online.
- Review your own habits carefully. Parents are the ultimate role models. Keep channels of communication open.
- Better safe than sorry. Make sure teens are comfortable telling you if anything menacing or cruel happens

CAREERS

At the Yr 8 and 10 subject selection evening I spoke to students and their caregivers about my role as a Careers Adviser. The role of a Careers Adviser is to discuss curriculum choice and post HSC options and to offer advice, suggestions, information and starting points for individual research for students. *Ultimately, the responsibility for research and confirming all details with TAFE Uni etc. lies with the student and his/her family.*

Communication

Personal Access: students and caregivers are able to access me during school hours at recess and lunch times and before and after school by appointment.

Email: students and caregivers are welcome to contact me any time and I will respond.

Year 12 Study periods: I speak to the students about the latest developments in careers, what scholarships are available, and display all undergraduate material that is sent to me.

Student Daily Notices: I often have brief messages on the daily notices which are read out in class by the Roll Teacher.

Liaison with Teachers: I work closely with both Mrs Clarke (KAS Indigenous Support Officer) and Mr Pita (Stage 6 Dean) in providing career information and excursion opportunities.

Excursions: various opportunities to visit universities, TAFE, Careers expos etc. and the University Road Show are available during the year. Make the most of them!! The best way to find out about something is to go there and have a look and get a feel for the place.

Notice Boards: There are two Career notice boards in the school, one in the library and one outside the staffroom. The library also has all undergraduate material, Open Day posters and ATAR Cut-off recommendations displayed.

Guest Speakers: various opportunities throughout the year will arise for students and parents to attend presentations by guest speakers such as tertiary student liaison officers. This is an ideal opportunity to get the information from experts in their various fields.
