### NAPLAN 2015 - A SNAPSHOT OF POSITIVE PROGRESS AT KAS

By now, families whose children participated in the Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 NAPLAN testing in 2015 should have received a letter containing a report on their child's assessment results. It is important to note that NAPLAN is a set of stand alone tests which may or may not accurately reflect a given child's level of competence or progress. When seeking to assess a child's competence, most school's and research authorities will use a range of data, including assessments such as NAPLAN to triangulate or map a child or class's progress to more accurately reflect progress and achievement.

Given that NAPLAN has now existed for a number of years, the real value of this assessment process is the fact that we can observe a child's progress over time. For example, the scaled growth score for an entire class between Year 3 and Year 5 allows us to measure more accurately the value add that a child has gained in the time between the two NAPLAN assessments. Whilst there is still the possibility of inaccurate scores with individual children, the chances of that occurring across an entire class is greatly reduced. Hence, when we look at class growth between assessment periods, we can reasonably assume that the data is accurate.

An assessment of scaled growth between assessments at KAS for the period 2013 to 2015 shows many areas of positive growth. The same data also shows a much smaller number of areas where the growth for students at KAS is slightly below the state average. This type of data assessment forms an important part of the school's internal processes of refining our teaching and learning as we better understand the needs of both individual students and classes.

Some examples include:

- Student growth at KAS in reading Year 3 (2013) to Year 5 (2015) was slightly below the average state growth, whereas student growth at KAS in reading Year 7 (2013) to Year 9 (2015) was above the average state growth.
- Student growth at KAS in writing Year 7 (2013) to Year 9 (2015) was below the average state growth, whereas student growth at KAS in writing Year 3 & 5 (2013) to Year 5 & 7 (2015) was well above

the average State growth.

- Student growth at KAS in spelling Year 3 (2013) to Year 5 (2015) was slightly above the average state growth, whereas student growth at KAS in spelling Year 7 (2013) to Year 9 (2015) was slightly below the average state growth.
- Student growth at KAS in grammar and punctuation Year 5 (2013) to Year 7 (2015) was slightly below the average state growth, whereas student growth at KAS in grammar and punctuation Year 7 (2013) to Year 9 (2015) was well above the average state growth.
- Student growth at KAS in numeracy Year 3 (2013) to Year 5 (2015) was slightly below the average state growth, whereas student growth at KAS in writing Year 5 & 7 (2013) to Year 7 & 9 (2015) was well above the average state growth.

Whilst the above examples show real growth trends that are very useful in helping to inform both the school and families in regards to overall student growth, they also highlight the complexity of learning and achievement that can occur across the span of a given child's educational journey.

KAS is committed to using the data gleaned from sources such as NAPLAN, the ACER PAT tests and other valuable assessment tools to regularly evaluate the health of the school's learning programs. 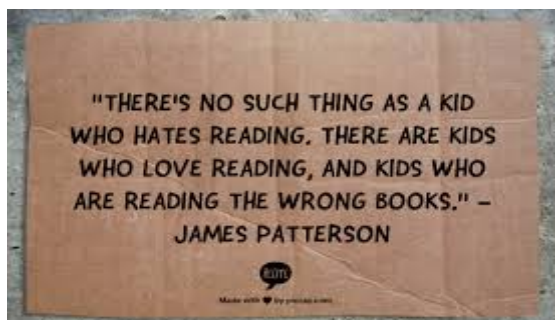
