ENSURING RELEVANCE BEYOND TODAY

Last week, the Queensland Government announced the introduction of a STEM (Science Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) syllabus for all K-10 students in that state from 2016 onwards. In NSW, the Board of Studies Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES), has also begun the process of moving towards a like program for students throughout this state.

Across Australia and throughout other western nations, STEM education, based upon the principles of project-based learning, has now been broadly accepted as providing a strong platform for teaching the critical skills identified through research as being required for all students entering the new employment marketplaces of the 21st century:

- Character Education
- Citizenship
- Communication
- Critical Thinking & Problem-Solving
- Collaboration
- Creativity & Imagination

At KAS, we have also begun the journey towards providing a fully-integrated, project-based learning and STEM education program throughout our K-10 classes. In 2016, this journey will, continue through both project-based learning and also the construction of our new K-12 STEM facility, due to open in 2017.

The key message at this time is not complex – if we are not preparing our students for the realities of this new century through programs such as STEM, we cannot expect our students to successfully compete for employment in the emerging global communities and economies.

Our collective commitment to growing the characters of our students, the first item on the list above, must be closely followed by the remaining five if we are truly aspiring to be a learning community which will be relevant beyond today.

The Grand Cardboard Challenge


Tuesday 1/12/15
